EXTERNAL EXAMINATIONS

The Cambridge Checkpoint and the WASSC examination 2018 were successfully concluded in May. The Cambridge 'O' and 'A' level papers are still in progress till June 9th, 2017. We are deeply thankful to our Triune God for abundant grace and favour that overshadowed our students' preparation and continue to trust Him to perfect the good work He has begun in them, crowning their effort with a bountiful harvest of A*, A1 and 6.0 grades in Jesus name.

EARLY DECISION PROGRAMME (FAST TRACK ADVANCED LEVEL PROGRAMME)

This is a win-win entry path to the most prestigious universities in the UK, USA, Canada and Nigeria. The Lifeforte Early Decision (ED) programme is an accelerated Advanced level programme which compresses the standard 2 year course into an 18 month course. The rigorous nature of the course provides adequate preparation for the demands of undergraduate studies. Admission offers into top universities have already been secured by the current set of students in the Early Decision 2018 class. We also provide support with specialized examinations such as SAT's (1&2), BMAT, UKCAT AND LNAT.

INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (IJSCE) 2018

The IJSCE examinations will commence on June 4th 2018 and will be concluded by the end of the third week of June 2018. It is an examination based on the broad-based Key Stage 3 syllabus that assesses students in 14 core and 2 optional subjects. The best student overall with an A* in at least 10 core subjects (Maths, English and Science inclusive) and 3 A's will be offered a 50% scholarship (on tuition) for the entire duration of their senior high school tenure. Lifeforte operates a combined educational system – the Nigerian curriculum and the Cambridge International Examination curriculum. Under this dual curricula system, parents may opt for either of the two streams from Grade 10.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

MORNING ASSEMBLY

This half term featured truly engaging and educative programmes geared towards creating an exciting out-of-class learning atmosphere.

English Open Championship:

An exciting English quiz in which students' understanding of subject-verb agreement and later parallel structures was tested. To everyone's surprise, a Grade 7 student Daniel Taiwo came out tops while second and third positions went to Tamilore Toru and Hannah-Ruth Balogun both of grade 8.

Impromptu Debate with the topic 'Nigerian Youths are "Lazy" True or False? A passionate and engaging discourse ensued at the end of which the enterprising spirit of our nation's youths was proven beyond doubt.

Business Plan Presentation:

A presentation to the rest of the school by two grade 10 students based on their business plan to utilise a budget of \$10,000. Selected from a sizeable pool on the basis of originality, comprehensiveness and relevance to contemporary societal needs were Oruaro Mukoro's well thought out plan to provide value-added low cost housing and Chloe Isele's presentation to roll out a unique line of African Ankara accessories to promote African culture. Global citizenship skills:

In a bid to further promote a global mindset in our students, a short and compelling presentation was done to highlight the following 21st century learner namely: **Self-awareness** (by Adetola Owoade), **Communication** (by Amara Otike-Odibi), **Collaboration** (by Buchi Chinedu-Okoro) and **Creative thinking** (by Ibim Soibi-Harry).

Career Talk:

Our feature on careers this term explored prospects of students who major in Geography, Physics and Literature. The opportunities, combinations and marketability of career choices whose foundation is in these subjects was well explored to encourage and inspire students with a desire along these lines.

Good Samaritan Project (Giving is Living; Living is Giving):

Using the instructive parable of the Good Samaritan and our cherished Mummy CEO's powerful phrase, the quartet of Ukabiala Ebube, Adeyanju Ayomikun, Olopade Joshua-David and Charissa Basse-Albert stirred the hearts of their colleagues to be more compassionate towards the less privileged living in our communities. Consequently, our students have committed to bring along used yet useful items such as clothes, shoes and other materials that could be given to their indigent counterparts in neighbouring schools within our Awotan-Apete community.

LEARNERS' ENGAGEMENT AWARD

As a means of demonstrating that they are taking more responsibility for their learning, students in each class were required to prepare and display on their class notice boards posters, mind maps, charts and pictures on interesting topics and themes learnt this term. A team of teachers, having assessed both concepts and materials, are back with a verdict: the winning class is **Grade 11J** while **grades 8D and 7P** came in second and third place respectively. Well done.

HOLIDAY ASSIGNMENT - Project reflection of learning

Over the mid-term break and in preparation for Promotion exams, students are required to reflect on topics covered this half term in the respective subjects.

Junior Grades

Grades 7 and 8 are to prepare a reflection scrap book of what they have learnt over the half-term, dedicate at least a page to each subject, summarizing topics using bullet points, mind maps, charts, pictures and short notes. The scrap book must be neatly bound. This is due upon resumption – Monday 4th June, 2018.

Senior Grades

Grades 10 and 11 are required to submit a digital scrapbook of what they have learnt. Scrapbooks should contain a concise summary of topics covered in all subjects using Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Excel and other relevant tools. These should be saved on a flash drive with name and class indicated. Remember submission date is 4th June 2018; creativity is a plus!

LEARNING IS FUN

This programme was a brainchild of the A level class and aimed to stimulate a more positive attitude towards learning. Illustrated with the aid of PowerPoint slides, persuasive arguments and vivid examples, speakers focussed, in their first episode, on the challenge of time management. Students were inspired to embrace practical tips that enable us use available time judiciously. In the second episode, effective study techniques were illustrated such as the use of flashcards, mind maps, outlines and charts with examples. We were all reminded to plan for study periods well ahead and to be courageous to find new ways to make learning fun and exciting.

PAYMENT OF BILLS


