CLUB 2030 LAUNCH

The first outing was an exciting Power Point presentation by our Social prefects, Iyanuoluwa Joshua and Bolugbe Adesanmi to the school community on the aims and objectives of the SDG's.

SDG One - No Poverty

The introduction of this goal was followed by a vibrant panel discussion involving a team of grade 12 students: Esosa Osunde, Tolu Oso, Kachi Anyiam, Oghosa Osunde and Bolugbe Adesanmi who explored current global trends in reducing poverty and proffered the novel idea to reduce poverty by re-organising the Young Entrepreneurs Club into three business units; *Agripreneurs, Ecopreneurs and Craftpreneurs* who will seek out innovative enterprise solutions using minimum cost raw materials to make products and generate income for the local community.

SDG Two - Zero Hunger

In sequel, Grade 9 students put together a stimulating presentation on SDG 2 (Zero Hunger) consisting of a brief discussion followed by a TED talk video on this goal and a quick facts quiz between Boys and Girls on SDG 2 goal and targets. The boys edged out the girls by just one point.

Grow A Garden Farm (Zero Hunger Project)

Sequel to CEO Dr. (Mrs) Sarah Johnson delivering a lecture at an IITA seminar for Young Agricpreneurs earlier this year, the school revived its garden farm. The project aims to encourage students to embrace agriculture and agro - allied disciplines and to teach them basic skills that will enable them grow their own gardens toward eradicating hunger and enjoy the rewards of being an agricpreneur.
